We appreciate you coming out today to celebrate a very important woman. Thank you for your outpouring of love, prayers, and support during this time in our life.

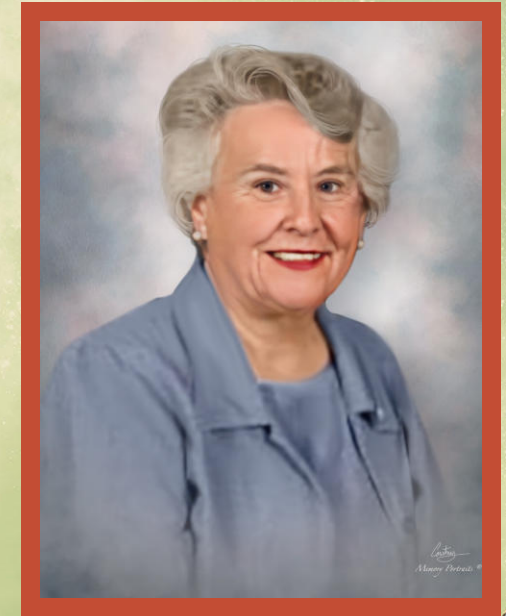


When you remember Sue Jane, we hope you remember her strong faith and love of God, her love of traveling and new adventures, reading, singing, growing plants, and watching the birds.

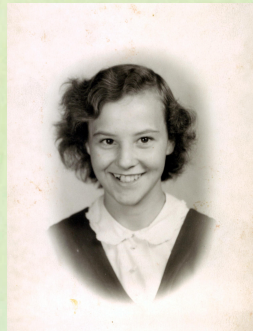
