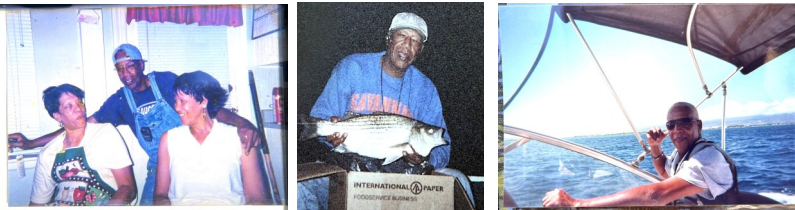

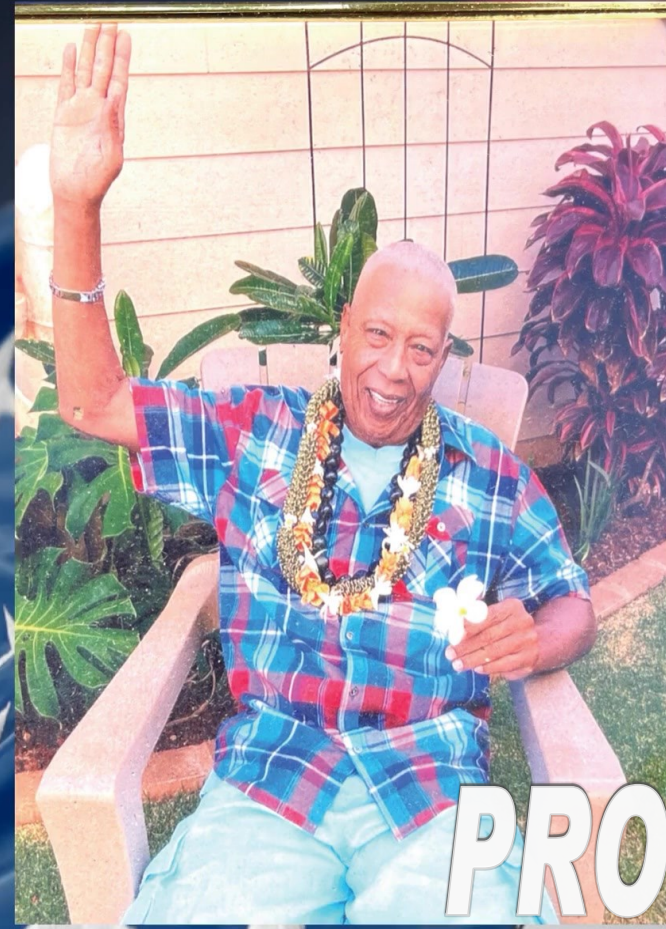

Obituary
