suffer, and saw her fade away.

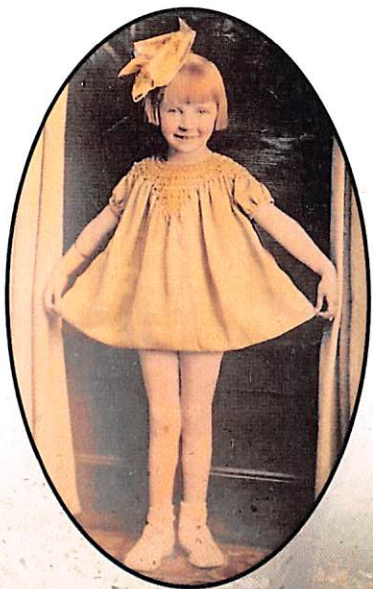
Although we loved her dearly,
