I thought about you yesterday

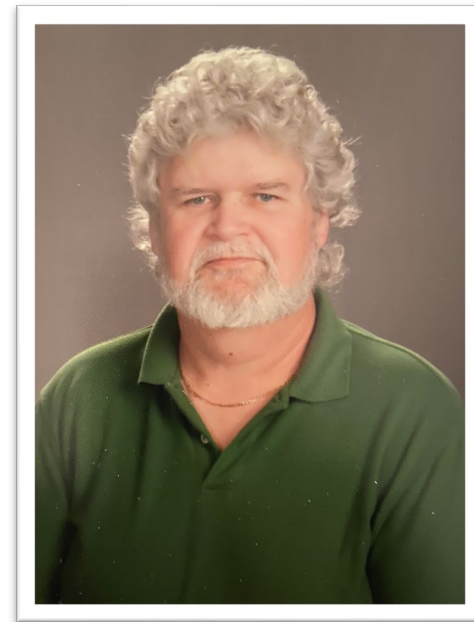
and days before that too,
