Music was another thing she enjoyed – in her younger years she played the accordian and later on in life the organ. She loved the old songs and if there was dancing her toes would tap until someone asked her to dance – she loved to dance.

Bargain hunting was another hobby she had – thrift shops- garage sales and in later years – the Dollar Store. She would proudly display her latest find! She also enjoyed going to the casino. If she could get there those penny slots got a good workout. She loved the chance to win big. But her biggest excitement was when that Publisher Clearing House entry arrived. She was insistent – she would be the next winner! Had to get that mailed back ASAP!!

With her Birthday being May 6th, just before Mothers Day – family always made sure she got blooming flowers for both. She loved getting pots of happy blooming flowers to put about the house and yard. Her favorite are tulips, peonies, iris, and lilies. They always brought a smile when she got them. Marlene passed away on Tuesday, February 15, 2022. She is survived by her husband, Wilford, three children: Mark (Dolly), Cindy Miller, Sally (Joe) Sletten; six grandchildren: four great grandchildren, two brothers. She was preceded in death by her parents; sister, and brother.
