

Your affection and care, eternal


I wish i could hold the clock From ticking away so fast I wish you were here with me Right beside me everyday



Your heart can be empty because you cannot see


or you can be full of the love we have shared. You can turn your back on tomorrow and live yesterday,




# Accomplishments
