### How to: Make an Apple Crisp

I will show you how to make an apple crisp. Let's get started!

First, you get out a 9X9 pan and heat the oven to 375 degrees.

Once that is done, wash, peel and cut some apples, then put the cut up apples in the pan.

In a separate bowl mix together:

1/4 tsp cinnamon

1/3 Cup flour

1/2 Cup brown sugar

1/2 Cup oats

1/3 Cup oil

Put the mix on top of the apples.

Bake for 45 min. You can double this recipe, and you can also use whatever kind of fruit you want! – Havilah, 5<sup>th</sup> grade
