Herbert was born March 21, 1927 in St. Joseph Missouri to parents Harry Brown and Elizabeth Yancy Brown. Throughout all of this, he remained an avid gardener of vegetables and loved growing flowers, especially on his 'half whiskey barrels' on his front porch.

Herbert was preceded in death by his parents, and seven siblings.
