From Pastor's Desk

The scripture for today is **Nehemiah 4:17**

"They who built on the wall, and they that bore burdens, so burdened themselves, everyone with one of his hands worked in the work, and with the other hand held a weapon."

Nehemiah, having received a commission from the king of Persia, returned to Jerusalem to repair the city and rebuild the broken down wall. The city had been destroyed by the Babylonians and the walls broken down. The people living in the city had been in that weakened condition for a long time. We might find in our lives that the enemy has caused devastation that has left us vulnerable and weak. The very will to resist may not exist and we settle for a life of subordination to the oppression. But, even though the walls of protection may appear to be broken down, God has not forsaken us. He will restore to wholeness those who come to Him in faith. Nehemiah was a man of faith. He did not flinch at the accusations of the enemy, nor did he become fearful of their threats. The people stood with Nehemiah and chose to build the wall; they decided to face the enemy. They worked with one hand and held a weapon with the other; they stood in faith and showed that they were unafraid. In a very real and spiritual sense, we can work holding our weapons just as they did. God worked through them and the wall was built so fast that everyone was amazed. They knew that it was the hand of God that made it possible. God will do the same for us. He will restore us to our rightful place of security if we come to Him in faith and allow Him to work through us. Those who put their trust in God, without fear, will always prevail. When we are in Him, victory is assured!
