Kevin Matthew Neufeld, 36, formerly of McPherson, KS, passed away on Saturday, February 5, 2022, in Downer's Grove, IL. He was a construction worker and United States Army Veteran.

Kevin was born on October 9, 1985, in Newton, KS, the son of Paul Stanley and Rhonda Kay (Epp) Neufeld. He graduated from McPherson High School in 2004.

He joined the United States Army in 2006 and served one deployment to Iraq as a Radar Specialist. He was his platoon leader in basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO. He was first in his MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) class, 1st Battalion, 78th Field Artillery. He was honorably discharged in 2011.

Kevin joined God's family at an early age. He enjoyed his early childhood life on the family dairy farm in northeast Marion County, KS. He loved his military life, which gave him direction, and serving his country.

He struggled with PTSD through military service. This led to his struggles, homelessness, and addictions for the remainder of his life.

Kevin is now in the presence of his Lord, completely healed from his addictions and struggles.

He is survived by: his parents, Stan & Carla Neufeld of McPherson, KS and Rhonda Liles of Grove, OK; two brothers, Scott Neufeld of Grove, OK and Daniel Word of Wichita, KS; three sisters, Laura (Dustin) Hendricks of Canton, KS, Amy (Josh) White of McPherson, KS, and Megan (Roby) Levika of Kansas City, MO; nephews, Cohen Hendricks, Cade Hendricks, and Otto White; nieces, Kristin Neufeld, Harper White, and Mia Levika; and many aunts, uncles, and cousins.
