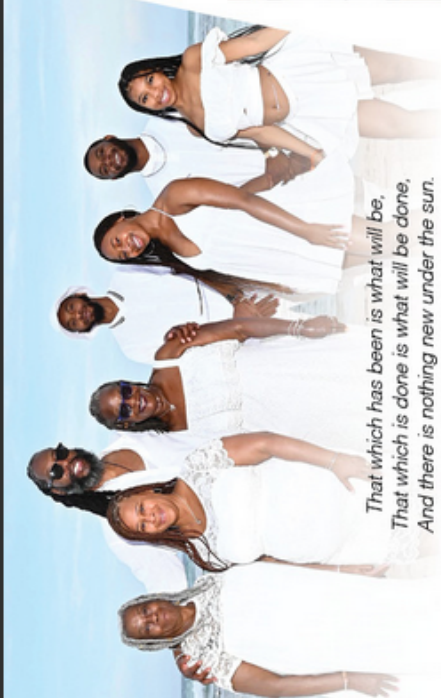




*That which has been is what will be,
