### Food Pantry

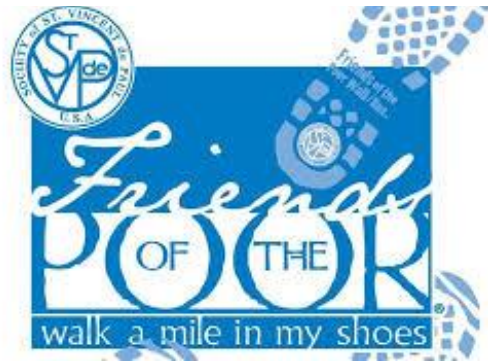
All Saints has donated 100 pounds of food and 5 pounds of produce. Thank you to all who contributed to this important ministry.
