Aaron Lee Warren was born on July 7, 1939, to LeRoy and Anna Warren, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where he spent the duration of his life until his departing. Born the eldest child and only son to his parents, Aaron became that child who was precocious, always smart, active and extremely inquisitive to the pride of his father and the dismay of his mother.

Aaron's early childhood and teen years from 1945 to 1957 was spent in the Philadelphia Public School System navigating its halls and being his personable self while being the smartest kid in the class to the most mischievous one, that drove his teachers to distraction. This fortunate position led him safely home to his family and friends. Upon his return home he secured a position working for the Oscar Mayer organization, where he met and in 1976 married his beloved wife of almost 50 years Edna Dudley, acquiring bonus daughters, and a little bundle of joy late in life Keturah Nicole.

Aaron's retirement years was often plagued with illness and misfortune, but he never forgot to fight for the life that he was given, and he never stopped believing in the God that gave him that life. So as his journey now ends this battle is no longer his. So let us pray he is now free from all pain, suffering and discourse and resting peacefully in the Father's mighty hands. Therefore, he leaves behind this day to rejoice in his memory, his beloved wife Edna; a daughter who preceded him in death Adorn Renee; three beautiful daughters Keturah, Linda, Brenda (Clement, III), two bonus daughters Penelope (Abraham) and Wanda (Edward); his grandsons Quentin, Clement IV, and Aaryn; granddaughters Brittany, Sydney, and Megan; two great granddaughters; his siblings Marion, Rebecca and Audrey; three nephews, two nieces and a host of family and friends.
