Bertha's Life Story

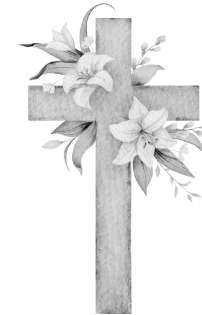
