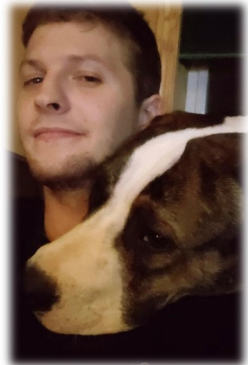

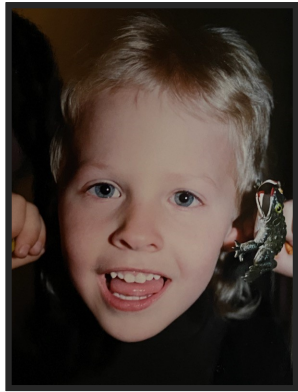

at the close of day.

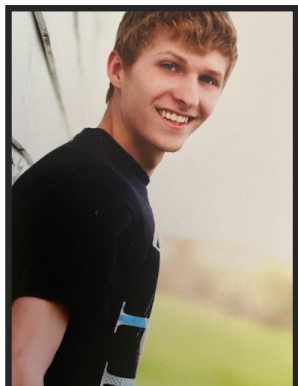
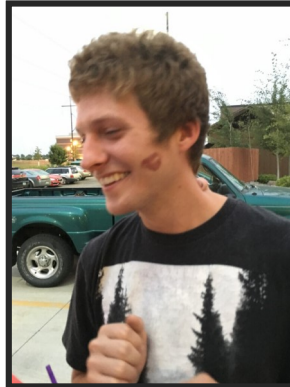
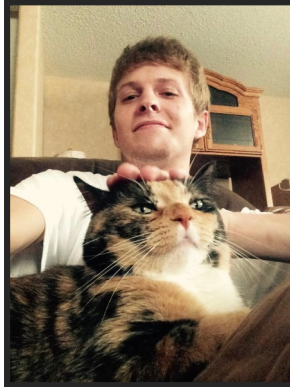
If my parting
