She was a graduate of Western Christian High School in Hull, Iowa. Wanda was united in marriage with Lawrence Baartman on January 11, 1965, in Boyden, Iowa. The couple made their home on a farm southwest of Rock

Valley, Iowa where they raised their three children. Lawrence died March 22, 2004, and Wanda moved into Rock Valley. In addition to being a homemaker, Wanda worked part-time as a nurse's aid in Rock Valley and later worked at K-Products in Orange City, Iowa. She also worked part-time at Boehringer Ingelheim in Sioux Center, Iowa.

Wanda died Saturday, May 14, 2022, at Avera McKennan Hospital in Sioux Falls, South Dakota at the age of 77.
