FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS

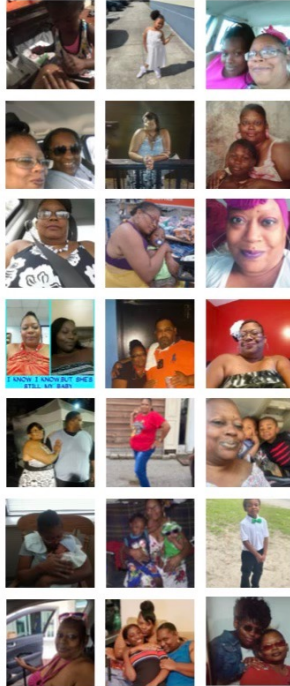
