I couldn't help thinking about Marele Day's *The Life and Crimes of Harry Lavender* quite a lot whilst I was reading *ADDICT*. Though a rather different beast from Harry Lavender, *ADDICT* is intelligent and fresh in much the same way Day's book was in the late 80s. Set in the near future,

Addict combines the engrossing, tenebrous elements of 1930s noir crime fiction with the spectacle and possibility of science fiction. The characters are engaging and memorable, slowly building relationships and inviting us into their psyches. Setting and atmosphere are amongst the strongest elements of *ADDICT*.
