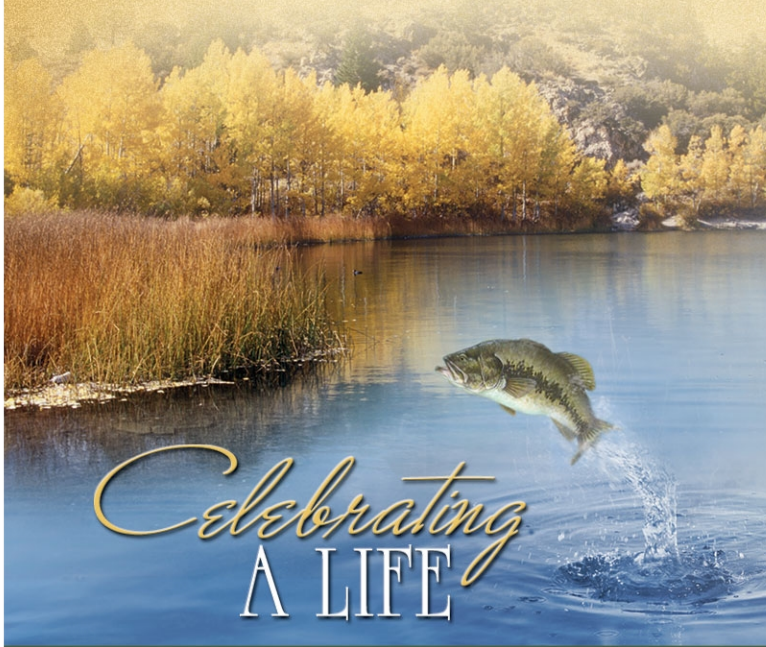


God took the strength of a mountain,
