SELECTED READINGS FOR REFLECTION

If this would have been a traditional Celebration of Life service, we would have incorporated some of the following as readings from the Bible:

Psalm 23 "The Lord is my Shepherd..." Probably the most popular reading selected for Celebration of Life services and, understandably, a powerful passage.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 "There is a time for everything...a time to be born and a time to die..."

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work...Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves, a cord of three strands is not quickly broken." This was the Bible reading used at our wedding service.

Isaiah 43:1-3a This is a signature verse used at baptisms at Sunne and is the "I have called you by name; you are mine..." passage. Verses 2 and 3, however, have a strong symbolism for anyone going through radiation and chemotherapy treatments for cancer.

Romans 5:1-8 A passage about faith, suffering, and perseverance, ending with "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

II Corinthians 4:7-12 I call this one the "Treasures in Jars of Clay" passage. My interpretation is that when we die, we enter heaven with our "treasures," our talents, good works, and other spiritual investments we have made on earth that can be taken with us.

A reading from the Gospel:

John 14:1-14 "Let not your hearts be troubled...I go to prepare a place for you...."

Readings to be read at the committal portion of this Celebration of Life service:

Romans 14:8 I Corinthians 15:51-57 John 11:25-26
