DWELL IN THE *house of the Lord forever.*

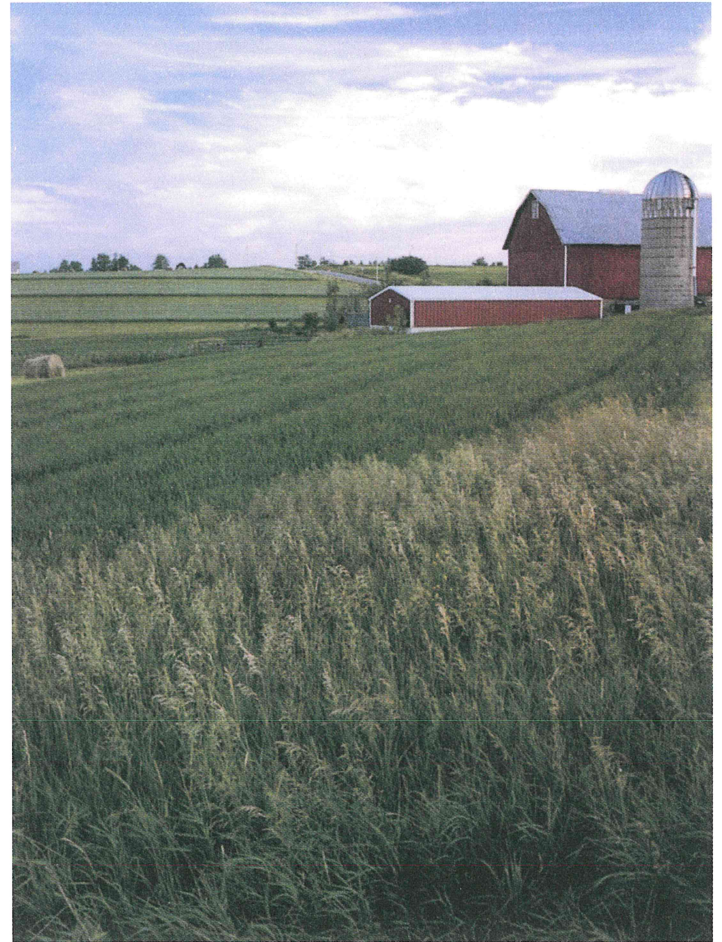
