Calvert Arts Festival is coming soon. Have you marked your calendar for May 12th? This year's merry-making will be held from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM and will feature a wide array of talented local musicians and vocalists. Nearly forty juried artisans of unique art and handcrafts will be present, as well as local wineries and craft brewers. We have some returning artisans, as well as new vendors juried in for the first time this year. In addition, the Festival this year will present a variety of original skits by local actors, based on Calvert County's history and its colonial roots. Since All Saints Church has been celebrating its 325th birthday, Calvert County's colonial history has provided

the inspiration for this year's activities, to include colonial games and crafts for children, reenactments of colonial times, storytelling and music. All are invited to wear something reminiscent of colonial times! Here will be something for everyone and admission is free!

This year's charitable beneficiaries will be: Project Echo; Calvert Collaborative for Children and Youth; Community Ministry of Calvert County; the Child Advocacy Center; and Patuxent Habitat for Humanity. These charities all help to relieve the hardships of homelessness, or focus on enriching opportunities for young people. They will share the Festival's proceeds, equally.




