Harold Charles Morman, age 90, of Mandan, passed away on Sunday, January 2, 2022.

Harold was born January 29, 1931, in Haymarsh, North Dakota to Henry and Philomena “Minnie” (Tavis) Morman. On June 28, 1954, he married Bernice Keller in Beulah, ND. They immediately moved to Mandan where they made their home, raised their family, and lived until their passing’s.

In 1951, Harold was drafted into the US Army and trained as a radio operator, serving his country during the Korean Conflict. He achieved the rank of Staff Sergeant at his discharge from the 7<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division in 1953.

Following his discharge from the Army, Harold returned to working for Montana Dakota Utilities Company in Beulah. When the Heskett Station was built in Mandan, he was the first employee hired. Harold worked at the Heskett Station as Operations Superintendent, and at retirement had worked 43 years for MDU.

Harold spent his retirement caring for his beloved grandchildren. Most days the grandkids could be found out in the shop with Grandpa, tinkering on some project. When thanked for his chauffeur and babysitting services, Grandpa Harold would quip that all he did was ‘supervise’.

Harold was preceded in death by his wife, Bernice.
