

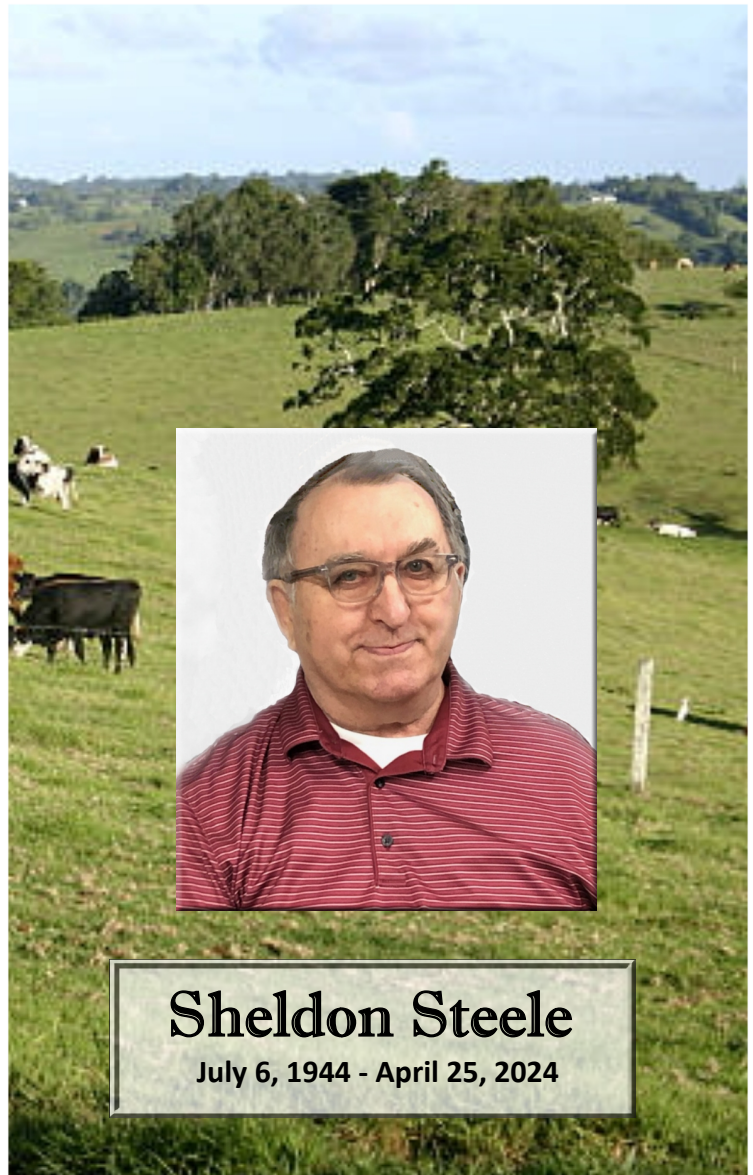
When It's My Turn to go Home

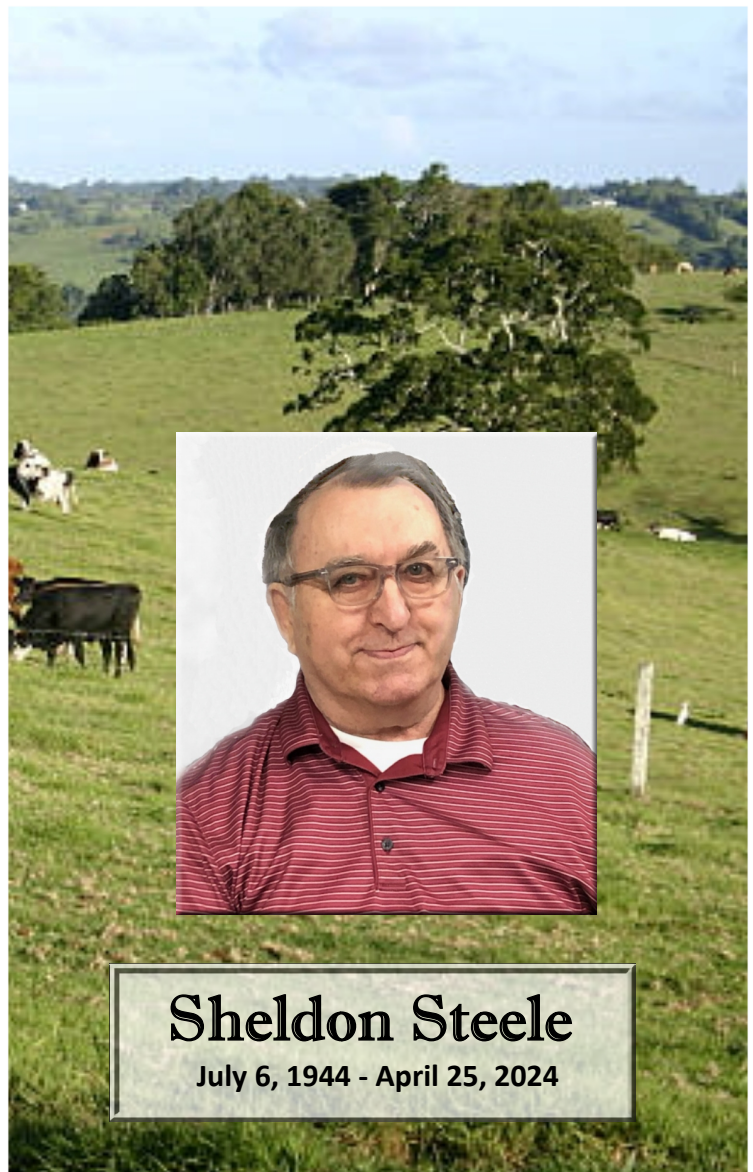
