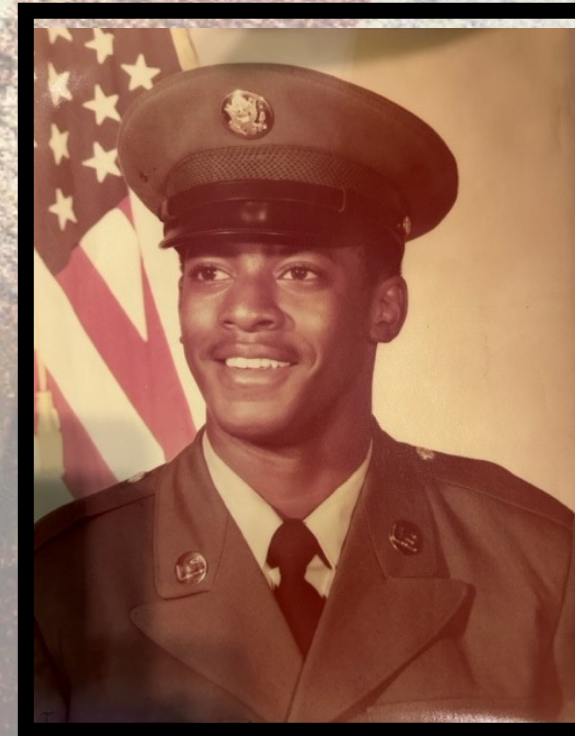

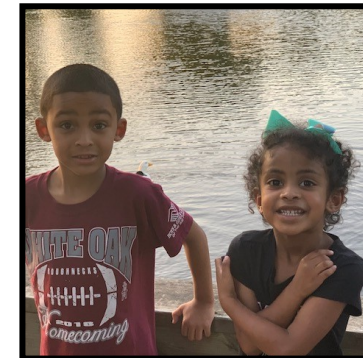
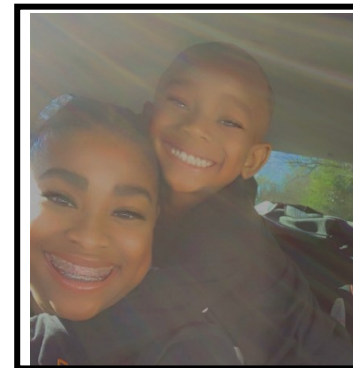


To all my loved ones
