## A Week At A Glance!

This week we had so much fun learning about Dr. Seuss and his many books. We learned that his real name is Theodore Seuss Geisel. In such stories like, *There is a Wocket in my Pocket*, it gave our students great opportunities in finding real and made-up rhyming words. Each day of the week students made a craft that went with one of the books that we read. Tuesday, the kids sewed a pocket and stuck the wocket inside! On Wednesday students chose to make either duck feet, a long tail, or a elephant nose for the book, *I Wish that I had Duck Feet..* On Thursday the classes made Thing 1 or Thing 2 by blowing blue paint to make the hair. Lastly, on Friday our class made the cat in the hat while enjoying the storybook.

In math we learned more about nickels and counting by fives. We played several games as a group on the computer. Students reviewed

telling time by the hour and half hour as well as using beads to add sums up to 20.

Our letter of the week was "Ww". Our class learned what sound it makes as well as exploring different kinds of words that start with this letter.

Our sight word this week was "does". We learned how to spell it and how it is used in a sentence. We practiced forming the letters in the word, cutting, pasting, and coloring this word in our Sight Word book.

The vocab word the students learned this week was "shore". Students learned the meaning of the word: "at the edge of the water." and put it into a verbal sentence.

Ms. Short taught our class songs that they played rhythm instruments as accompaniment using a drum, sticks, and a xylophone. Another song with partners was another favorite.

In Bible this week the class learned about Daniel. We read the story of how Daniel and his friends requested healthy food for ten days and how God blessed them. We enjoyed worship outside on Thursday by singing songs, saying our memory verse and acting out the story of the Fiery Furnace.

The K-2 Grade Teachers planned our family groups activity today which was a big hit. Each classroom was set up like an "escape room" where the students had to figure out the five clues (all about manners) to be able to then exit as a group.

Multiple Intelligence activities included decorating your own duct tape wallet and playing with coins. Another station was drawing pictures of W Words. Picture smart center was watercolor painting a windmill. At the body smart station, students followed a work-out video. Our kids investigated wood and explored balancing items on a weigh-scale.
