Arlen Gene Nelson was born on April 11, 1932, to Hans and Esther Nelson in Minnesota Falls Township of Yellow Medicine County, MN. He was confirmed on May 30, 1948. He attended school through the eighth grade. He enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in 1953 and did his basic training at Camp Pendleton. He served in the Korean Conflict and was honorably discharged in 1955.
