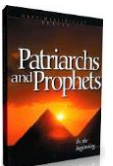

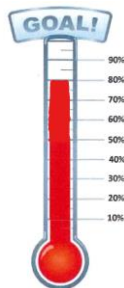

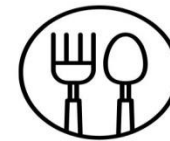

# MGA January Happenings

**Love one another as I have loved you.” John 13:34.** What an enriching, supportive command this was from Jesus! The Chinese New Year, which took place on Jan. 25, provided a fantastic way to experience a new culture, allowing us to be responsible world citizens and appreciate our foreign exchange students’ customs. We all realize it must be difficult to be an exchange student with custom and language differences, but learning about this holiday could be one way of respecting anew our ESL students. Three events aided us in vicariously experiencing this holiday:

- 1) The foreign students went out to dinner in Arcadia to a fabulous, authentic Chinese restaurant with Mr. Wilkinson, our ESL coordinator.
- 2) A special high school chapel giving us information about the holiday was presented by Mr. Wilkinson, as well. A power point explained the Chinese New Year and the signs of various animals they use: this is the year of the rat. We also watched videos on firecrackers (which originated in China) and shadow puppets (which are unique to China.) Our drama group, under the direction of Mr. Prindle, presented a sketch based on “The Monkey King,” and traditional Chinese New Year gold coins were given to students.
- 3) The senior class voted to have a luncheon on that day with three of our class members, Winnie Hsaio, Shana Yang, and Kindy Zhao, fixing a Chinese feast for us. The food was a traditional hot pot, which involved large kettles of water that each student could add chopped vegetable ingredients that they had chosen individually. Kindy’s home-stay family, Ken and Janelle Bietz hosted us in their beautiful backyard. Winnie’s father contributed to the festive meal by sending us unique delicious pastries from Taiwan. The multicultural experience was so much fun!

**Essential questions: what are they? How do they reinforce the rigor of MGA’s high school academics?**

Mr. Riddle had the following things to say about this topic: “Recently, some of our students (with teacher guidance) have been exploring what it takes to make a good habit stick. Generally, it takes about 21 days of consistent ‘practice’ to make that happen.

“Question: As a teacher, do you really see value in starting most of your study sessions with your learning goals clearly defined (essential question, learning goals, big picture concept)? As a school, we do see value in this because it leads to greater focus for our students, parents, and yes, teachers. We have been focusing on the concept of defining clearly for our students, what they will be learning during each class or study session.

“At a recent assembly we looked at one of the study skills we are focusing on this year—note-taking. Essential to good note-taking is the idea of ‘essential questions’. We will be challenging students to develop the use of these study skills. It follows that we will also be challenging them to be looking for your learning goal or essential question.

“Our students learn from us most often through modeling. During the month of February (approximately 21 school days), I will challenge our students to be looking out for your “essential question” or learning goal for each class, and to ask you about it, if it isn’t clearly provided. So I am, by default, challenging you to 21 days of making sure that your students know what you want them to learn.”
