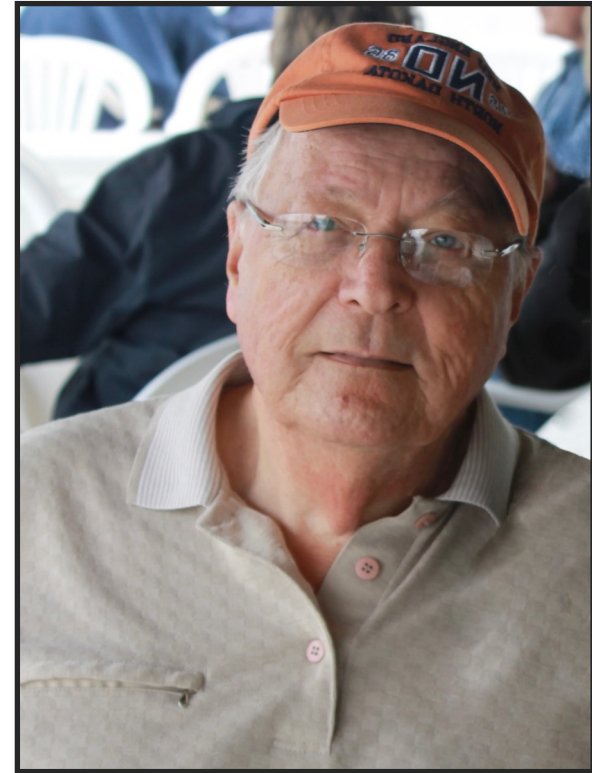

wounds and injuries.*


*May those who have made the ultimate sacrifice
