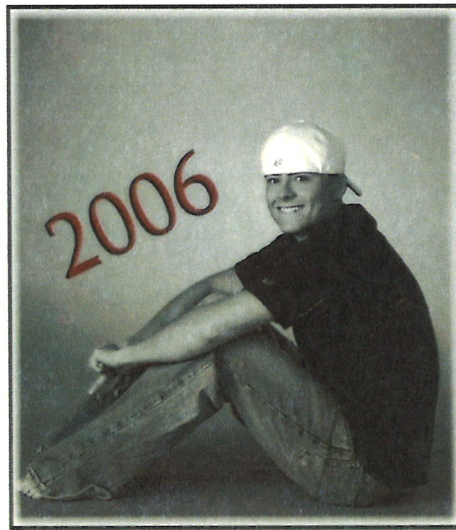
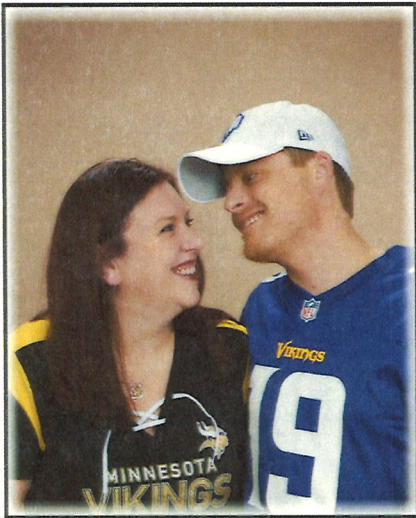
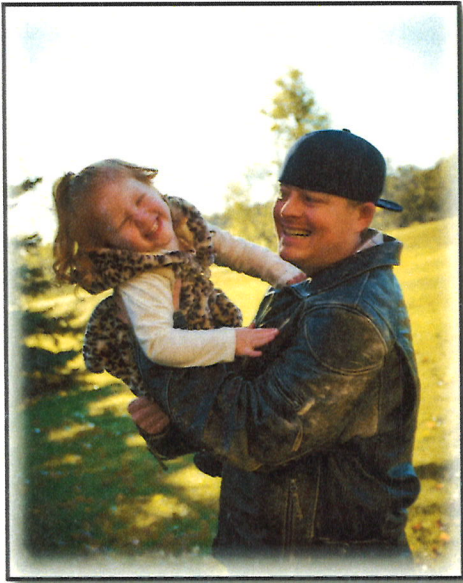


In Loving Memory
