Gwen, also known as Jeanie and Cool Breeze, was the 4th of 9 children and the only girl.

Gwen went on to have 5 children: James Watson, Anthony Canty, Maurice Canty, Gwendolyn "Gwenie" Canty and April (Bell) Brown. Gwen often referred to Gwenie as her "stylist" and April as her "strength" and "change-of-life baby." Gwen talked to Maurice every morning, afternoon and evening without fail about everything and nothing at the same time. James as the oldest son cherished Gwen's cooking. Anthony as the second-oldest was the most outspoken.

Gwen was educated and attended Robert Morris Elementary School, Harding Junior High School and William Penn High School, all a part of the School District of Philadelphia which she believed in so much. Gwen was unable to complete high school due to family obligations. With the support of family and friends, Gwen would later go on to get her high school diploma in 2003 from Benjamin Franklin High School at the age of 61.

Gwen believed so much in the power of education and the school district of Philadelphia that she held several positions beginning in 1984 including Bus Monitor, Office Aide, SSA, and Climate Staff as well as volunteering after retiring in 2008.

Gwen believed in working hard and playing hard. Not only did she dedicate her life to children and staff at Spring Garden Elementary School but she was an avid dancer, Pitty-Pat and Tunk card Player. Cool Breeze could often be seen toting her lucky 10 of Clubs in Richard Allen Projects and later at Zion Garden Apartments and any event that involved Pitty-Pat. She also took every opportunity to do the Moonwalk to any song that gave her a beat to move her feet. Gwen was also an avid Eagles and Sixers fan, sporting her jerseys on game days.
