Marjorie Kahl (née Black), 98, Bismarck, N.D., passed away peacefully on January 2, 2024.

She was born June 5, 1925 to Harry and Edna Black and had three siblings, Jean, Mary, and Lester. She grew up on a small farm east of Carrington, North Dakota. She attended a one-room rural elementary school and rode a horse back-and-forth to school. She attended high school in Carrington, North Dakota, living with her maternal grandparents, Joseph and Mary O'Leary.

After graduating from high school, she went to work at the Gambles store in Carrington, where

she met Charles Kahl, a widower with three teenage sons, Wesley, Keith, and Charles (Chuck). Marj and Charles married in 1947. They had three children, Douglas, Marla, and Steven.
