They standed a love of fly fishing, duck hunting, back packing, and hiking, And, briefly, there was the beach house on Galveston Island. Shortly after ownership a hurricane swept away the beach but not the house so the state claimed the cacement as the shoreline "rolled" inland thus making the house uninhabitable. Jim's life was a life marked by humor, love and unwavering independence. He will be dearly missed.
