In Loving Memory of Morris "Barney" Sherman Jr. December 28, 1952 — February 2, 2024

Morris and Ruth (Scott) Sherman in Savannah, Georgia and attended Haven Home Elementary School and Richard Arnold High School before enlisting in the United State Army.

Morris attended Basic Training in Fort Jackson, South Carolina. Upon completion, he continued Advanced Individual Training as a Motor Transport Operator at Fort Lewis, Washington. Mr. Sherman was then assigned to Fort Wainwright, Alaska and Seoul Korea where he met his future wife Kyong Hui (Jeanne). While stationed in Seoul Korea, he had many amazing stories of his time there. He wrote, called home, and told his family of the fun filled experiences that he encountered as he embraced the food and landscapes. Upon returning from Korea, he was stationed at Fort Hood in Killeen, Texas where he was separated from active duty and the US Army Reserves. Ultimately he was recognized for his honorable service with a National Defense Service Medal, Army Driver and Mechanics Badge, Army Reserve Components, Achievement Medal, and Expert Rifle Medal.

After proudly serving in the army, as a civilian he was employed as truck driver for Centex, a concrete company in Killeen, Texas. After relocating back to Savanah, GA, he was employed as a truck driver for local concrete company, but due a serious trucking accident, he chose to change his career path and set his goal to work at Savannah School of Art Design as a laborer, and rose up the ranks to a foreman until his health declined and could no longer work full-time because his leg amputation.




Family Who Went Before


Family He Left Behind


