

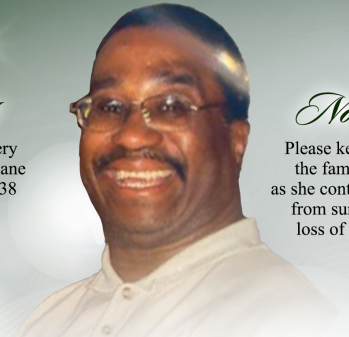

# Life Story

Nathaniel Green known as Nate, was born on September 13, 1952 to the late Russell Sr. and Willene Green in Philadelphia, PA.

As a youth, while attending Tenth Memorial Baptist Church with parents and siblings, Nate accepted Christ and was baptized. He participated in various ministries for youth along with Sunday School. His favorite scripture was Matthew 6:9-13.

Nate was educated in the Philadelphia public school system and graduated from Edison High School in 1970. He received his certification as a nursing aide from Philadelphia Training Center, and a few years later he went back to achieve his LPN from James Martin School of Nursing.

Nate married his loving wife on June 26, 1982 at Tenth Memorial Baptist Church. They loved traveling taking cruises to Bahamas, Jamaica, and frequent trips to West Palm Beach, Florida. In 1983 they were very excited about purchasing their current home. On their 10th anniversary, Nate and Helen renewed their vows and dedication to God, at their home.

Nathaniel worked as a nurse for 23 years collectively between Albert Einstein Hospital, Bayada Home Health Care, and Girard Medical Center. He enjoyed his work as a nursing professional and also joined Black Nurses Rock Philadelphia Chapter. After decades of tireless service in the nursing field, Nate retired in 2018.

In his free time, Nate loved watching his beloved Philadelphia Eagles. One of his greatest joys was being able to witness the Philadelphia Eagles win a Superbowl Championship in 2018. He loved football so much that he volunteered a year as an assistant coach with the Olney Eagles youth football team. Nate also enjoyed occasionally having New Year's Eve party. Nate was famous for his corny jokes and quirky sense of humor.

Nate was very active in planning and attending annual Green Family Reunions for many years connecting with relatives from various cities. He would occasionally attend True Light Fellowship Church's Sunday Worship Services, Family & Friends Day, and other special events with his wife, Helen.

In the past few years when Nate's health began to fail, instead of complaining when someone would ask him how he was doing, he would often respond, "I'm verbal and vertical."

Nate was preceded in death by his parents, sisters Queen Ester and Carolyn; brothers Russell, Jr. and Aaron; sister-in-law, Sadie Brown Hudson and brother-in-law, Grover Reed, Jr.
