
### Poetry Corner:

We have touched on classroom rules, colors, shapes and tracing. Having their names on cubbies, caddy and activity tray is a great way to start letter recognition.

It's always interesting to see where each child is socially as well as academically. Then customize activities to reinforce what each child knows and then challenge them to move towards the next step.

## Geography Spotlight:

Antarctica has big glaciers. In Antarctica there are no polar bears, but there are penguins, seals, whales, and sea-birds. There are a lot of different penguins and birds such as Emperor penguins, Adelle penguins, chinstrap penguins, and more. Adelle penguins are black and white. Emperor penguins are black, white and yellow. Chinstrap penguins are light pink, black and white. Chinstrap penguins have a black line on their neck. When I said light pink on the chinstrap penguins, I mean light pink under their arms. Emperor penguins have babies. When the baby is in the egg, the dad penguin puts the egg between his feet while the mom penguin gets food. Baby penguins are very fluffy.

There are also Elephant seals. There are six species of seals. The elephant seals are gray. The Elephant seal has a big nose. Some seals in Antarctica are cute. The emperor penguins are big and penguins have blubber. – Sydney (3rd grade)
