

Chap loved to socialize; he never met a stranger. You could always find him on the dance floor no matter what song was playing.

Chap loved to dance! He had a particular fondness for "old school" music. His favorite artists were The Dells, Johnnie Guitar Watson, and Sade to name a few.





On July 13, 1968, Chap married Bayonne Sanders and became father to her seven children, which he loved as his own. For 54 blissful years, Chap and Bayonne were inseparable. They were husband and wife, best friends, and perfect companions. Bayonne saved every single Birthday, Valentine's Day and Mother's Day card that she received from Chap for 54 years. No matter the cost of the card, \$30.00 or \$1.00, she cherished them all. Bayonne stated that "Chap was my one true love, my best friend. I will forever love Chap."

Chap was a Denver Bronco and Denver Nuggets fan! He would often cheer on the home team with his closest friends, Louis Smith, Larry (Robin) Green, and Bill Wilkins.
