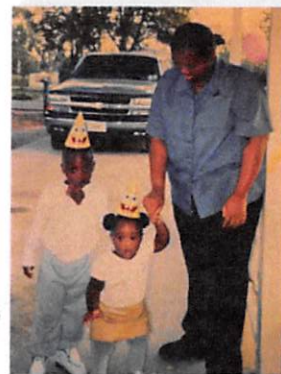
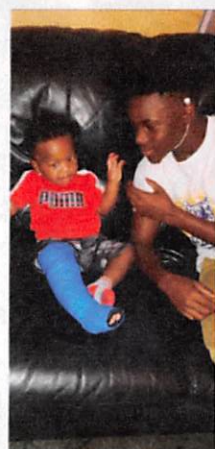


The moment that you left me

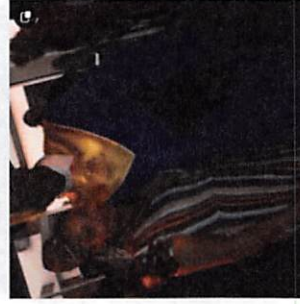
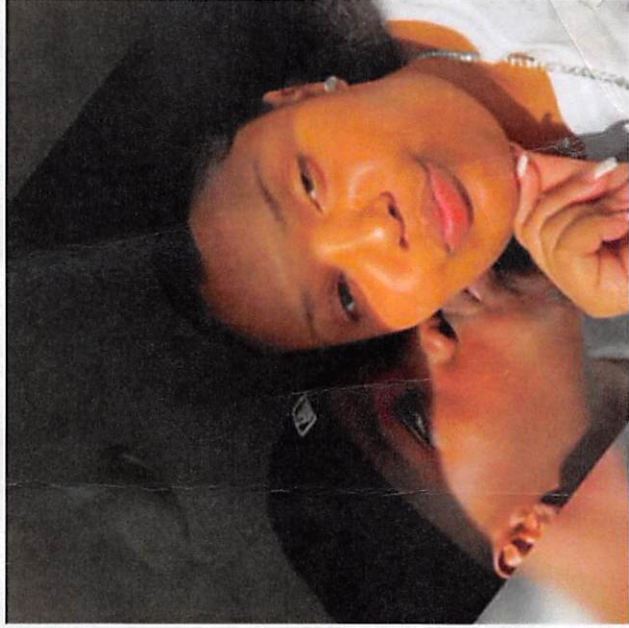

Because a part of me went with you

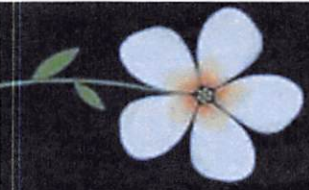
When Heaven called you home
