- TODAY'S OFFERING: Conference K-12 Scholarship Fund.** is a Southeastern California Conference offering used to subsidize scholarships for worthy students in Transitional Kindergarten through 12th grade in local conference elementary schools and academies.
The K-12 offering is used by the Office of Education to assist schools in providing assistance to the increasing number of families needing financial aid. This is done primarily through the Low Income Scholarship, which will pay up to 10% of the cost of tuition. That 10% is matched by the local school, allowing the recipient to receive 20% of his tuition.

GENERAL

18. **JAMES D. STANDISH, JD, MBA, BBA:** James has held official positions on White House and United Nations committees, led broad coalitions at the UN in New York and Capitol Hill in Washington, coordinated large grass roots advocacy campaigns, and worked for the US Government as executive director of the US Commission on International Religious Freedom. He’s met with many world leaders, and has spoken at the UN Human Rights Commission in Geneva, testified before the US Congress and has spoken at an event in the British Parliament. He’s met with two US Presidents, five US Secretaries of State, and numerous Prime Ministers, legislators and cabinet members from governments around the globe. He began an annual dinner to highlight the fundamental human right of religious freedom. Among the keynote speakers he secured for the event are Hillary Clinton, John McCain and John Kerry.

But James is more than a lawyer with a gift for influencing others, he is a global citizen with a heart for the world’s poorest and most marginalized. James’ first real job was teaching English to refugees on the Thai-Laotian boarder when he was fourteen. But it was hardly the beginning of his global trek. He grew up on the island of Penang in Malaysia, lived in Australia, Thailand, Singapore, the UK and the US. He has traveled extensively, from India to Nigeria, Vietnam to Guatemala, from Morocco to tiny island of Emirau in northern Papua New Guinea. Along with his legal, administrative and advocacy work, he’s successfully represented, pro bono, asylum seekers from Liberia.

James earned his law degree, cum laude, from Georgetown University, his MBA from the Darden Graduate School of Business at the University of Virginia which is currently ranked among the top three MBA programs in the world by The Economist, and his BBA from Newbold College, England, where he was student association president. His wife of 25 years, Dr. Leisa Morton-Standish, earned her PhD in education from the University of Maryland. He has two daughters, Shea aged 14 and Skye aged 11. James currently has his own consulting practice based in Washington.
