All are invited to visit our beach house following the service. Walk our pier on the Sound, or just two blocks away is the beautiful beach. Snacks will be provided.


Dennis was taken to God too soon, but he lived and died on his terms.

Major Dennis L. Moore, US Army, (Retired), 76, of Emerald Isle, North Carolina, passed away of a heart attack on Monday, February 26, 2024, at his home.

A memorial service, with Masonic Rites, to honor Dennis' life will be held at 11 a.m., Saturday, April 6th at Munden Funeral Home in Morehead City, NC, officiated by Phil Stroud.

In 2025, Dennis will be interred, with military honors, at Arlington National Cemetery.

Dennis was born on September 5, 1947, in Nash County, North Carolina, to the late John O. Moore and Juanita L. Moore. He was a proud Vietnam Veteran and retired Major from the U.S. Army where he served with distinction. Dennis also was a Purple Heart recipient.
