1. Australian Club Championships

The first Australian Club Championships will be held this year at Carrara Squash Centre, Gold Coast from the 21st-23rd of September. 5. Australian Squash Tour (AST) & AST Finals

The Victorian Doubles Championships were held last weekend from the 7-8th of July, this was the 7th event of the tour. The next AST event is the Bendigo International from the 12-15th of July. The top 8 male and female players at the end of the tour, based on AST rankings, will be invited to play in the finals and the top 3 male and female players of this event will be awarded with a share in a prize fund of at least \$10,000.
