I can hear her telling me not to eat all her grapes (they were one of her favorite snacks) because "we didn't have to eat everything all up in one day." These moments made us who we are.

Today, we gather in gratitude, with hearts full of love for the woman who chose to sit at the center of our lives. **THANK YOU, GRANDMA,** for being our constant, for weaving your love into every meal, every laugh, every look.
