### **THE BROKEN CHAIN**

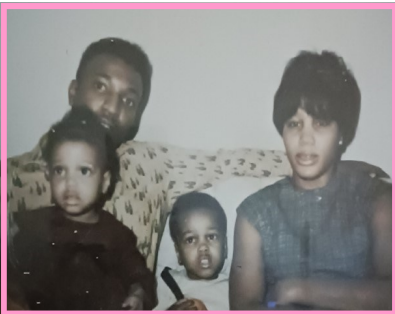

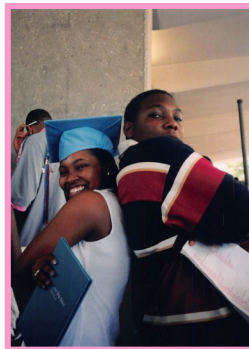
