Betty also worked various part time jobs to provide for her children including Church's Chicken, Glenn's Professional Maintenance, and heading shrimp. Betty left Georgia Regional after an incident which left her disabled. Betty lived the rest of her years, helping take care of her grandchildren, drinking her Pepsi's, smoking her Pall Malls (after Kool Filter King's became to expensive lol) hanging over her banister on Greengate Court or floating throughout the Savannah Summit being Betty.

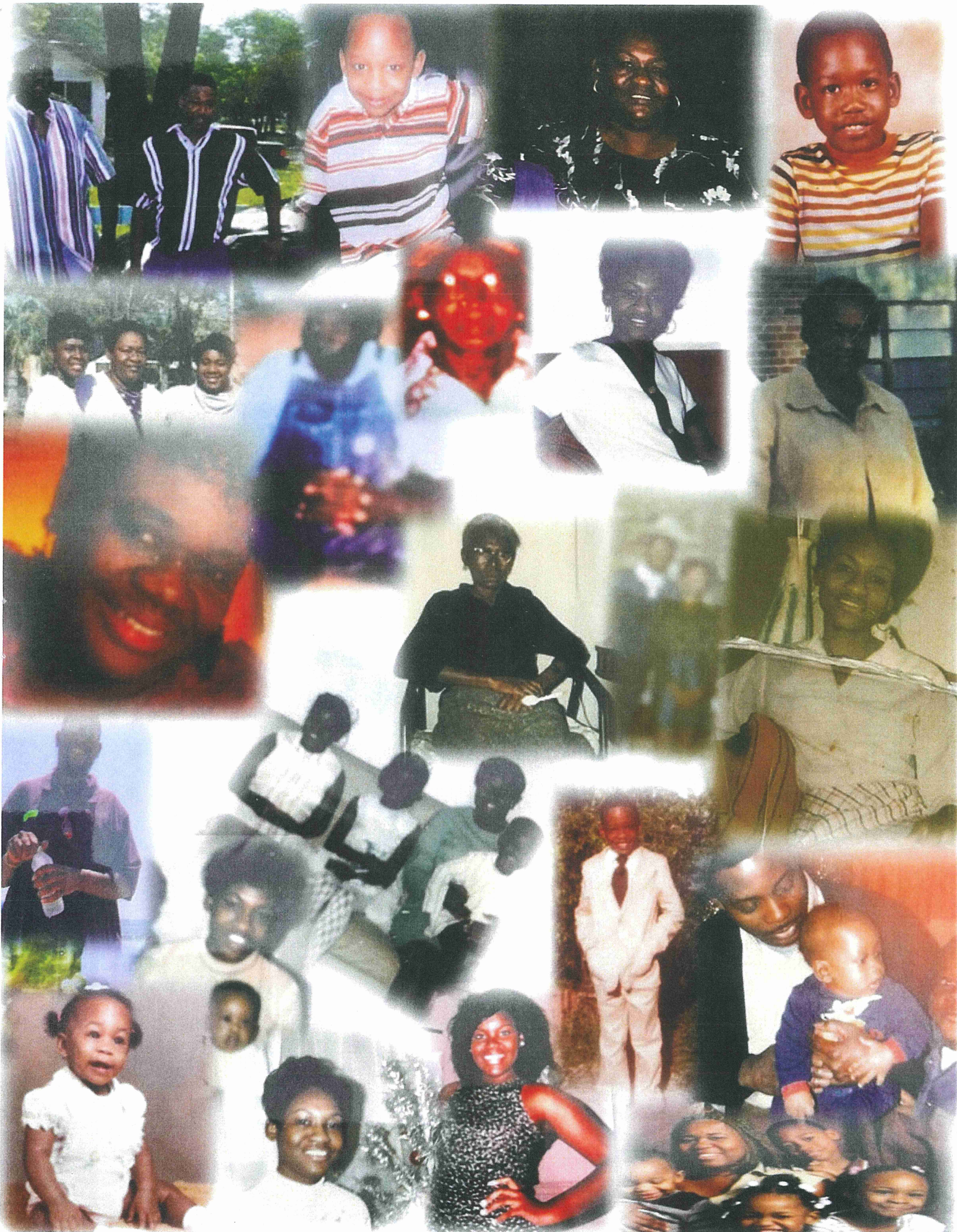


A Tribute to Mrs. Betty
