We are practicing a lot of new procedures that require self-discipline! **Ellen White** wrote in the book *Education*, "The object of discipline is the training of the child for self-government. He (the child) should be taught self-reliance and self-control." **Marie Montessori** wrote, "We call an individual disciplined when he is master of himself, and can, therefore, regulate his own conduct when it shall be necessary to follow some rule of life. Such a concept of active discipline is not easy either to comprehend or to apply." Our second goal this year is to learn to discipline ourselves. (The first goal is to Depend On God). As these goals are attempted and practiced your children will be free to advance in every subject area!

This week in 5/6 grade we went to the Gentry park to pick up trash. Thank you to the parents who volunteered to go with us and help us. You are much appreciated!!The students learned about giving back to the community in which you live. In Science we had studied and talked about the plastic epidemic. We watched a documentary, "The Plastics Problem." It is amazing that even in uninhabited areas of the earth there is plastic washing up on the shores from other parts of the world. The students wrote in their journals about possible solutions to the problem of plastic. We talked about the problems that it causes to the wildlife who ingest it thinking that it is food.

In Bible we talked about conversion as the extreme makeover process that Jesus does in our lives when we turn them over to him. Students thought of people who had a conversion experience and made Mobiles of their experiences. We have been playing "Sparkle," to help us memorize our Memory verse. We are also learning good character traits each week. This week we are learning to be attentive.

In Chapel this week, Alan Wiles came to talk to the students about Bullying. He teaches martial arts to many of our
