Dorisene's Life Journey

Dorisene Washington was born Dorisene Scott on April 18, 1939, in Preston, Mississippi, to the union of Charlie and Maudie Scott, both of whom preceded her in death. She was the seventh of nine children, six of whom also preceded her in death. Five brothers, Jim Henry Scott, Esaw Scott, Charles Scott, James D. Scott, and Myrdis Scott Sr., and one sister, Gloria Jean Lee-Edwards. Dorisene had one grandson, Larry D. Harper Jr., one great-grandson, Kayvion Jackson, and one great-great-granddaughter, Zyla Tate, to precede her in death.

Dorisene attended Preston Elementary and Whisenton High School in Dekalb, MS. She moved to Chicago, IL, and married her high school sweetheart, Lamuel Jackson. Four children were born into this union. Later, she met and married George Washington. She remained happily married until the passing of her beloved husband, George, in 2013. Dorisene was a faithful employee of EKCO Housewares company for over 15 years until the company closed. She then worked for LIEN Infection Control Systems until her retirement.

Dorisene was an outgoing, witty woman. Fun-loving and no-nonsense could also describe her. Compassionate and giving was her spirit; love was all you felt when you met her. She had a few anecdotes that she would say that summed up any situation you told her about. Her two favorites were "You ain't got a pot to piss in or the window to throw it out of" and "That's yo lil red wagon, you the one who gotta pull it." In 2002, Dorisene returned to her hometown of Preston, MS, and settled into a new chapter in her life. She became a caregiver of sorts. Dorisene cared for and gave anything and everything she could to anybody she came in contact with, whether it was a place to stay, a hearty meal, or even her last dollar. If she felt it helped you more, or you needed it more than her, it was yours, even if you were family or a random neighbor.

On May 3, 2024, God decided that Dorisene cared for and gave out enough, and it was time for those heavenly wings that she most definitely deserved.

Dorisene leaves to cherish her loving memories one sister, Abbie Ruth Chaisson of Lafayette, LA, and one brother, Lullie Scott of Preston, MS. 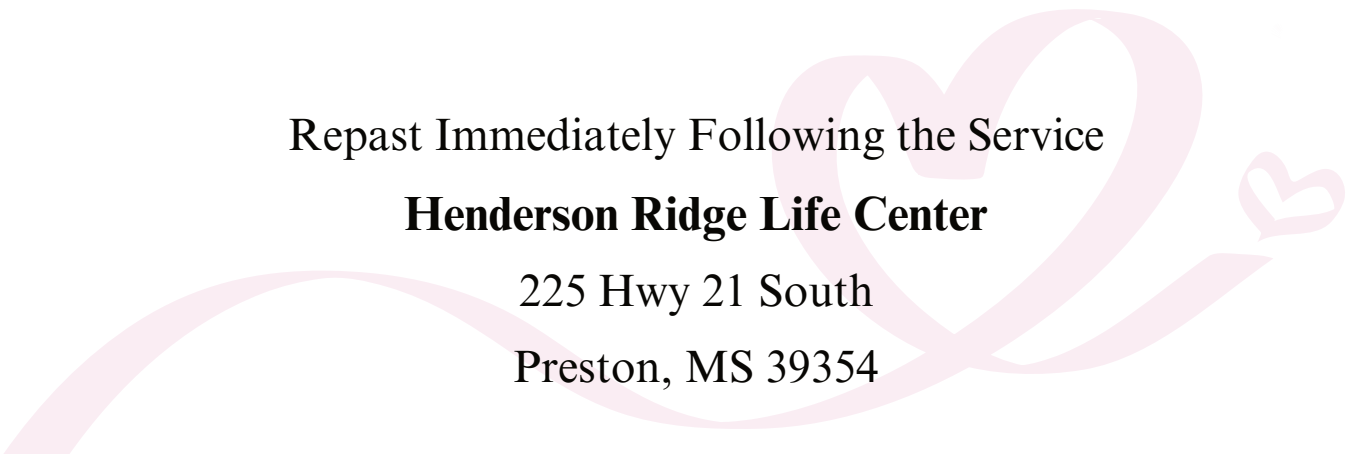
