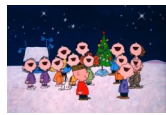
As parents, isn't this the life that we desire for our children? Unfortunately, if it's not real with us, the likelihood of it being real with them is drastically reduced.

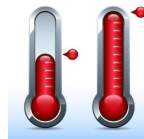
English Walnuts are for sale in the office for \$3 a bag and all proceeds will go to those who have been affected by the camp fire.



Feeding those in need: On Thursday a group of six high school students, led by Mrs. DeTar and Mrs. Wareham, traveled to Chico Oaks SDA School to prepare and serve lunch to all of the Paradise and Chico Oaks students and staff. The Paradise school is currently using the Chico Oaks SDA Church facilities to hold classes and both schools share the gymnasium. In all we were able to serve about 200 lunches to a very grateful group which included families who are still living in RV's on the school campus. Besides serving lunch, we also provided dinner for about 150 people who have been displaced by the devastating Camp Fire. We had an amazing day of service and were so grateful to have made a small but tangible impact on these families in need. Thanks to your generous donations at the Fall Food Festival we not only provided two delicious meals yesterday but also presented Monty Nystrom, Paradise Adventist Academy Principal, with a check for \$1,000 to help the school and families as they rebuild their lives following this tragedy.



Our school has been doing a **food drive** for three weeks now and it has been awesome!
