but you did not go alone.*

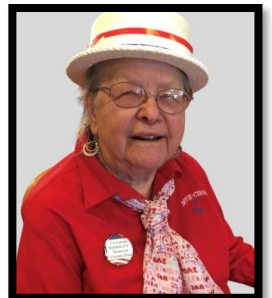
