Obituary

Sis. Jane was born James Ethel Bryant on December 20, 1943 in Savannah, Georgia to the late Mr. James (Cookie) Bryant and Mrs. Eliza Bradley Bryant. The fourth of seven children, she was known as a tomboy because she loved to climb trees every summer when they spent time in Greenpond, SC visiting her dad's family. She loved playing family games, putting on skits and doing fun activities with her family.

Sis. Jane grew up in Yamacraw Village and later in West Savannah. She was educated in the public school system of Savannah Chatham County. As a 1963 graduate of Sophronia Tompkins High School she was actively involved in several school activities, to include being a member of the Cheerleading Squad. Because of her sweet and welcoming personality, she formed lifelong friendships with all who came to know her. Her special childhood friend, Gladys Jackson, nicknamed her "Buck," a name that stuck with her for life.

Excelling in track and field and softball, she loved sports and is an original member of the West Savannah Whipperetts, a team that won city and state championships. One of the best softball teams in the country, they had a 55- straight- winning streak.

She was formerly married to Henry Robinson, and as a military wife she travelled across the country to places such as North Carolina, Fort Dix, New Jersey and Fort Knox, Kentucky; as well as overseas to Germany and Spain. She became an avid competitive bowler and won many championships. Together they raised two children, Robert Robinson and Crystal Robinson.

Upon returning to Savannah, Georgia she eventually became employed with the Savannah Chatham County Board of Education as a school nutrition employee at Robert W. Groves High School. There, EVERY child was treated as her own. She loved each one and they all knew it. Wherever she went, students would come up to her to give her a big hug. They were all her "boos." She gained lifelong sisterships at Groves, and even after her retirement in May of 2019, she would tell of the fun times she had with Mrs. Christine White and Ms. Carolyn Mikell.

Sis. Jane received the Lord Jesus Christ as her Savior over 30 years ago at Mt. Herman Baptist Church. When she came to the Lord she came running, and was soon on fire for Him and never looked back. The fruit of the Spirit began to increase quickly in her life.

She soon began even more to be known as Sweet Sister Jane – always had a smile on her face, always the same and never changed, and she never met a stranger. She became a chartered member of Believer's In The Word Full Gospel Ministry under the leadership of Rev. Alvin C. Edwards. As a member for over 20 years, she was lovingly known as "Mother;" and loved praising and worshipping The Lord and she could

beat the silver jingles (zills) off of her tambourine. Throughout the years Sis. Jane served on the Usher & Temple Ministry and whatever else her hands found to do.

In the beginning of 2022, Sis. Jane moved her membership to Everlasting Life Christian Church under the leadership of Apostle Van Marie Green. There she continued to operate in the Love of Jesus. She loved the preached Word of God from her Apostle and couldn't wait to talk about it at home saying.... "Girl Apostle preached that Word today!" And she was off and running talking about the message." She loved the Word of God and loved spending time reading the Word. Here again, Sis. Jane was known to be always smiling, always loving and always sharing the joy of Jesus. She was known to overflow with "Sweetness."

Sister Jane loved spending time with her family and close friends, and was a super fan of Marvel movies! Above all Mama (Sis. Jane) was a woman of God who TRUSTED God beyond a shadow of a doubt in ALL things! During "Pentecost Sunday" The Lord so beautifully spoke to Sister Jane through her Apostle, Apostle Van Marie Green, that she is just "COOL IN HIM", and she is with HIM (Jesus) either way!
