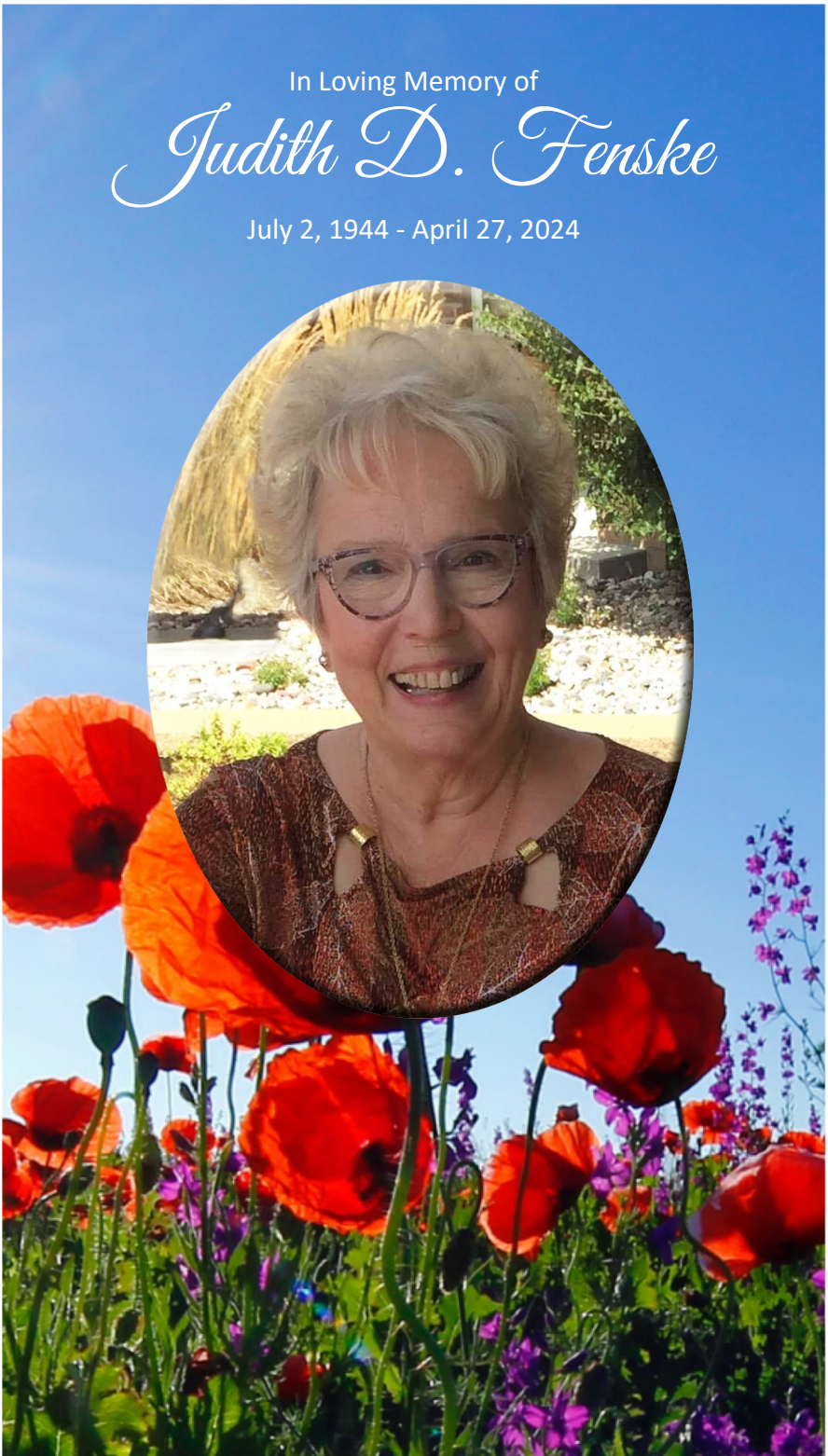

Judith Diane Fenske was born on July 2, 1944, to Peter and Hazel (Horning) Kuyper in Albert Lea, Minnesota. She grew up in Blue Earth, Minnesota where she graduated with the class of 1962. She furthered her education at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, where she studied elementary education and religion. On August 5, 1962, Judy was united in marriage to David Fenske at the First Presbyterian Church in Blue Earth. The couple lived various places until settling in Blue Earth in 1970, where they raised their three daughters. As the girls became older, Judy began working for the Blue Earth Post newspaper, selling advertising. In 1986, they moved to Rapid City, South Dakota. Here Judy obtained her real estate license and sold real estate for the next 25 years. Following retirement, the couple moved to Luverne, Minnesota, in 2013.
